SMALL GROUPS

Adults' Evening Out - Free babysitting at the church while you enjoy a "dutch" evening out together for adult fellowship.

Book Study - Meets monthly for a discussion on the latest book study read.

BYOB Men's Bible Study - Bring Your Own Bible Men's Bible study meets once a month.

Dinner Groups - Groups of eight meet for fellowship and dinner four times a year. Locations and menus planned by your individual groups.

Gals' Night In - Meets monthly for an evening of fun social activities.

Guitar Group - An outreach ministry that offers a place where beginners to advanced players can meet monthly to better their guitar playing skills with a Christian perspective. The group helps with the weekly Sunday School opening.

Parents' Morning Out - A Bible study that meets once a week at the church. Children welcome.

Prayer Shawl Ministry - Meets monthly for fellowship and knitting or crocheting shawls for the sick, elderly and homebound.

Quilting (Snip-its) - Women meet monthly to make quilts for Lutheran World Relief and enjoy fellowship while they serve.

Retiree Roundup - For all those who enjoy the blessings of retirement. Meets monthly for lunch and different activities such as speakers, field trips, and much more.

Women's Bible Studies - Meets in homes or at church once a month. Deborah at 10:00am and Agape at 1:00pm, on the 3rd Thursday of the month.

Women's Retreat - A yearly event for women of all ages to explore a new topic and enjoy learning, quiet time, exercise, and friendship.

WOW Morning Bible Study - Women meet every Wednesday for faith formation centered on the Bible.

SERVICE

Bereavement - Calling congregation members to help furnish food for funeral/memorial meals.

Blessings in a Backpack - Pack food for each weekend of the school year. The backpacks are delivered to schools in the Highland Lakes area and distributed to impoverished school children.

COMMITTEE SUPPORT

- □ *Serve on Congregation Council* Members are elected for a 3 yr. term by the congregation. The council meets monthly and supervises the work of the congregation throughout the year.
- □ *Worship and Music* Committee is responsible for helping to plan services, seeing that the worship leaders are properly informed and trained, and overseeing the quality of worship and music in the congregation.
- □ *Property* Committee is responsible for care and maintenance of the buildings, grounds, and equipment of the congregation. Do you have a specific expertise, such as lawn, flowers, electric, cleaning, etc. ?
- □ **Stewardship** Committee strives to educate members in the best way to utilize individual and corporate talents and gifts to build a strong congregation.
- □ *Fellowship* Committee has the responsibility of planning and conducting various congregational events to promote and strengthen fellowship in the congregation.
- □ **Evangelism** Committee develops an overall witness strategy for the congregation, educates and invites members into evangelism opportunities. This group plans, coordinates, and supervises programs for the inactive and unchurched.
- □ **Social Outreach** Committee works to extend Christian compassion and help persons in need in the congregation, community, and beyond. The committee looks for ways to help us all put our faith into action.
- □ *Endowment* Committee meets several times each year to review investments and discern disbursements, which support and extend the mission of St. Peter's.
- □ *Long Range Planning* Committee periodically examines and assesses opportunities for future development of the ministry of the congregation.
- □ *Faith Formation Committee -* This committee coordinates children and youth activities and education of the youth through Sunday School. It oversees all adult education and works on creating opportunities for intergenerational and family worship and learning. It also serves as the link from the St. Peter's School Board to the congregation.
- □ **Audit** Committee meets at the end of the year to audit the accounting of the congregation.
- ☐ *Green Team* Meets seasonally to discuss and put into practice ways to be green and care for creation. Plans a Care of Creation Sunday near Earth Day in the spring.

Worship

Lay Readers (Lector) - Read the first lesson(s).

Communion Assistants - Assist with communion distribution.

Ushers - assist in the worship service by handing out bulletins, helping with seating, gathering the offering, counting worshipers, directing communicants up to communion.

Greeters - Welcome members and visitors as they come to worship. **Choir** - for high school through adults. Rehearses on Wednesdays at 5:30 p.m.

Altar Guild - Prepares Communion each week for one month. **Nursery -** assists with children during church services - typically one Sunday a month.

Communion Bread - Provided for communion, either baked or purchased. Participants take their turn on Sundays.

Special Music - Members share singing or instrumental music in worship.

Tellers - Responsible for counting, recording and depositing the Sunday offerings after the late service.

TEACHING

Sunday School Ministry Team - Teach or assist during Sunday School.

Vacation Bible School - Provide a week of Christian education during the summer. Mornings only.

Vacation Bible School Helpers - Help with your choice of snacks, games, music, science, crafts, drama, etc.

Confirmation Mentors - Mentors/leaders for the junior high students during the school year. Confirmation is held at 4:00pm on Wednesdays.

Superkids Assistants - Can use special talents in music, acting, and art to create a Christmas program with 3 yr. olds through 5th graders.

Youth Sponsors - Help plan and implement special events or assist in all day or one time events. Sponsors must be at least 21 yrs. of age.
